## SAIDA ZUNNUNOVANING OʻZBEK ADABIYOTIDAGI ROLI VA UNING IJODIDA AYOL SIYMOSI TASVIRI

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Annotatsiya. Saida Zunnunova 20-asrning oʻzbek adabiyotida mashhur shaxslaridan biri boʻlib, uning asarlari ayollarni tasvirlashga chuqur e'tibor qaratgan. # SAIDA ZUNNUNOVA'NIN ÖZBEK EDEBIYATINDAKI ROLÜ VE ESERLERINDE BIR KADIN IŞARETI
