Shu davrda she'riyat asosiy adabiy janrga aylangan, biroq roman va nasr asarlari ham romantik idealni aks ettirgan, qahramonlik, kuchli hissiyotlar va ijtimoiy normalarga qarshi turish mavzularini o'z ichiga olgan.
