Beginning of the history of English language

Old English of the Anglo-Saxon period became Middle English, from the Norman occupation to the 15th century it was spoken to the end. The formation of the English language was followed by the conquest of Britain from the 8th to the 9th centuries and contacts with the north German languages spoken by the Scandinavians who colonized has had a significant impact; this connection has led to many lexical borrowing and grammatical simplification brought. An old Norman speaker who became Anglo-Norman in English the Norman Conquests influenced the language. Many loans in Norman and French included in the dictionary of language belonging to the church and judicial system." (Yusupova. S. 2023)

To date, Old English has survived in part in modern English dialects. The four main dialects of the language include: Mercian (Mercia Anglo-Saxon Language of the kingdom), Nortumbria (language of the medieval kingdom of Nortumbria), Kentish (Kent Language of his kingdom) and West Saxony; the latter of the literary norm in the Old English period it formed the basis. Although the dominant forms of Middle English and modern English are became a Mercia dialect.

Distribution of English in different states.

By the 1700s, English had already been introduced in Virginia and New England. the English language also begins to spread to Jamaica, Africa, by the middle of the 17th century. This has a significant impact on the languages of Africa. This led to the creation of pidgins and creoles (see Jamaican example) and the use of English as an official language alongside African languages. In the late 18th century

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Australia and New Zealand were accepted English language. During the 19th century the Indian subcontinent was colonized by the French and later by the English. Nowadays English is an official language in both India and Pakistan. covered and settled.
