Conversational or everyday speech

Stylistics focuses on how the choice of words, sentence structure, tone, and figurative language affects the meaning and perception of a message.


# **Methods of Stylistic Analysis**

Contextual Method – Analyzes the relationship between language and context. Stylistics relies on tools from phonetics, lexicology, grammar, and semantics,

and applies them to analyze artistic and non-artistic texts.
