With the help of children's stories, it becomes much easier for the child to absorb new words and language in general. After all, fairy tales are funny, engaging, and concise. They are often written in a language that children understand.

Listening to a story in a foreign language, a child not only acquires knowledge of that language but also learns a lot about the culture of another country. Children love fairy tales so much that if they really enjoy them, they will happily listen to the same story several times. Over time, children can recall individual words and phrases from that story. This makes it easier for them to learn a new language. In conclusion, it should be said that it is very beneficial when a child knows and speaks multiple languages. Knowledge of a language will open up more opportunities for them, boost their self-esteem, etc., but their future success will depend on how they embrace this knowledge and what emotions they experience during the learning process.

Thus, there are different ways of learning a language but, as it was mentioned in the article, it would be better to start doing it from the childhood and one of the beneficial ways to begin with, is to read fairy tales in a foreign language.
